

## **HEDIS Provider Guide:**

# Glycemic Status Assessment for Patients with Diabetes (GSD)

### **Measure Description**

Adults 18 to 75 years of age with diabetes (Type 1 and Type 2) who had their most recent glycemic status hemoglobin A1c (HbA1c), or glucose management indicator (GMI) was the following:

#### 1. Hemoglobin A1c (HbA1c) or Glucose Management Indicator (GMI)

- Glycemic Status (<8.0%)
- Glycemic Status (>9.0%)

Note: lower rate on this measure is better

#### Additional Important Measures for Patients with Diabetes

While the above measure is part of the Managed Care Accountability Set (MCAS) and held to the minimum performance level, the following measures will also be collected and reported:

- 2. Eye Exam (EED) (retinal) performed
- 3. Blood Pressure Control (BPD) (<140/90 mm Hg)
- 4. Kidney Health Evaluation (KED)
  - Estimated Glomerular Filtration Rate (eGFR) AND
  - Urine Albumin-Creatinine Ratio (uACR)
- 5. Statin Therapy (SPD) (40-75 years)
  - Received Statin Therapy
  - Statin Adherence 80%

Exclusions: Members in hospice or palliative care.

#### How to Improve HEDIS® Scores

- Review diabetes services needed at each office visit.
- Order labs prior to patient appointments.
- If point-of-care Hemoglobin A1c (HbA1c) or Glucose Management Indicator (GMI) tests are completed inoffice, it is helpful to bill for this. Also, ensure that the HbA1c/GMI result, and date of the test is documented in the chart.
- Adjust therapy to improve HbA1c/GMI and BP levels; follow-up with patients to monitor changes and adherence.
- A digital eye exam, remote imaging, and fundus photography can count if the results are read by an eye care professional (optometrist or ophthalmologist).
- Use CPT II 3072F if the eye exam was negative or showed a low risk for retinopathy in the prior year.
- Request a focused list of members who need diabetes care from your Blue Shield Promise Quality Program Manager.

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
